Course Details:

This is a **5-day introductory course** for musicians interested in exploring the idea of bringing music into healthcare and community spaces with a focus on older persons' settings. It includes a practical placement in local healthcare settings in Waterford City.

The Objectives of the Introductory Course:

- Understand the role of the healthcare musician and the appropriate placement of music in sensitive settings.
- Explore the skillset and best practice methods necessary to deliver quality interactions in Healthcare and Community Settings.
- Observe and take part in a Practical visit to a local Healthcare Setting (Subject to no restrictions being in place).
- Engage in Personal Reflective Practice, including healthcare setting visits, debriefing and evaluation.

The Programme Content will include:

- The approach and methods required for successful musical interactions in hospital and care home environments.
- Vocal and instrumental repertoire and improvisation
- Challenges of working in a team within a clinical space
- Ethics and confidentiality
- A self-care and mindfulness practice workshop
- Practical music placements in local healthcare settings

Criteria for selection [Essential]

- 1. Good instrumental or vocal level required whatever the musicians' initial training (e.g. classical, jazz, contemporary, folk or traditional).
- 2. A desire to get more out of your musical ability and explore the successful placement of music in a variety of off-stage settings such as Healthcare and Community support spaces.
- 3. An enthusiasm for varied Repertoire (Folk/Popular/Classical/Contemporary/Traditional) and willingness to expand your range of music throughout the project
- 4. Portability of Instrument / Use of Voice
- 5. Commitment of your time to embrace the personal and professional development activities this course will provide.

Desirable

- 1. Excellent communication and interpersonal skills with an ambition to engage effectively through music
- 2. Capacity and flexibility to learn and work as part of a team.
- 3. Creative ability


